Education Technology	<ul> <li>Technology infrastructure, including devices and equipment for students and teachers</li> <li>Purchasing software applications and digital platforms</li> <li>Digital and online instructional resources</li> <li>Devices or equipment to provide internet access (i.e., hot spots) for students who do not have access at home</li> <li>Supplemental equipment and devices (i.e., computers, web cameras) for virtual learning/online instruction</li> <li>Technology-related professional development for district and school staff</li> <li>Technology support or training for parents and guardians</li> <li>Integrating well-rounded educational services into online learning</li> <li>Virtual instruction programs, platforms, and tools</li> <li>Resources to engage all students and their families with virtual education, especially prioritize disadvantaged populations listed in CARES Act § 18003(d)(4)</li> </ul>
Mental Health Supports	<ul> <li>Counseling and mental health supports</li> <li>Professional development on the mental health services</li> <li>Training for school personnel on suicide prevention, trauma, and related issues</li> <li>Helping school personnel have meaningful interactions with students during school closures</li> </ul>
Summer/ Supplemental Learning	<ul> <li>Support for online learning (i.e. curriculum, digital instructional materials, technology, etc.)</li> <li>Instructional support services for summer engagement</li> <li>Behavior support strategies for online environments</li> <li>Coordinating with Institutions of Higher Education (IHE) to provide access to postsecondary courses</li> <li>Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental afterschool tutoring</li> <li>Summer learning and supplemental after-school programs targeted to prioritize disadvantaged populations listed in CARES Act § 18003(d)(4)</li> </ul>
Other Approved Activities	<ul> <li>Developing feedback mechanisms to improve working conditions</li> <li>Relationship-building skills and effective communication strategies</li> <li>Behavior support strategies for online environments</li> <li>Provide professional development or training to staff to use online learning platforms (virtual or in-person)</li> </ul>
