Overview of the Prayer Certification








Purpose

ESEA § 8524(b) requires that, as a condition of receiving ESEA funds, an LEA must certify in writing to its SEA that it has no policy that prevents, or otherwise denies participation in, constitutionally protected prayer in public schools.



Prayer Certification Application Supplement






Rationale for New Prayer Certification Application Supplement

- The new Prayer Certification Application Supplement is a simplified process for LEAs with no required uploads.
- The department will be able to access data quickly for reporting purposes to the U.S. Department of Education. (ED)




How to Navigate the Platform

 Representative role may click Draft Started.











- Access each individual page of the Prayer Certification from the Sections Page.
- Select the Prayer Certification page to complete the questions










