

Overview of the Prayer Certification








Purpose

 ESEA § 9524(b) requires that, as a condition of receiving ESEA funds, an LEA must certify in writing to its SEA that it has no policy that prevents, or otherwise denies participation in, constitutionally protected prayer in public schools.

Rationale for Prayer Certification embedded in ePlan


- The Prayer Certification Report is a simplified process for LEAs with no required uploads.
- The department will be able to access data quickly for reporting purposes to the U.S. Department of Education.





How to Navigate the Platform


