Affirmation of Meaningful Private School Consultation & Final Agreement

Combined Affirmation & Agreement forms with private schools are due in ePlan by May 1.

Overview

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) §§ 1117 and 8501 require local educational agencies (LEAs) to provide equitable services to students and teachers in eligible private schools. The requirement of providing equitable services is achieved through timely and meaningful consultation between the LEA and private school officials. The consultation process must occur prior to any decision that affects the opportunities of eligible private school students, teachers, and other educational personnel for equitable services. This consultation must be ongoing, continuing throughout the implementation and assessment of these activities. Further, LEAs are required to finalize all ESSA equitable service agreements with private school officials. An Affirmation of Meaningful Private School Consultation and Agreement form shall be signed by the LEA and private official(s) and uploaded ePlan with the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA). LEAs that have uploaded consultation agreements for each participating private school will have satisfied the ESSA requirement that consultation agreements be forwarded to the ombudsman.

State Ombudsman

To help ensure equitable services and other benefits are being provided for eligible private school students, teachers, and other educational personnel, the state must designate an ombudsman to monitor and enforce the requirements under both Title I and Title VIII. Tennessee has designated the department's Title II and equitable services coordinator as the ombudsman for ESSA equitable services requirements. If there has been no consultation or agreement between the LEA and the private school, a complaint may be filed on behalf of the private school by completing the Complaint to the Ombudsman form found in eplan.tn.gov > TDOE Resources > ESSA/IDEA Private Schools Information & Documents. Complaints must be signed by the individual(s) or organization(s) filing the complaint and copied to the LEA. Complaints must be sent to the department to the attention of the ombudsman via email to Michelle.Harless@tn.gov.

Combined Affirmation of Meaningful Private School Consultation & Agreement

This sample form covers the meaningful consultation process (Part I) <u>and</u> final agreement (Part II) between an LEA and a private school and can be edited to meet stakeholders' needs. The completed form must be uploaded annually (in May) by the LEA to ePlan as part of the initial submission of the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA). Agreements must be signed by representatives of both the LEA and private school. If a final agreement has not been reached by the May CFA deadline, LEAs have the option of submitting the final agreement by **Sept. 15** utilizing the <u>Traditional Private Final Agreement</u> form.
