

Waivers for a School-Wide Title I Program

Overview School-Wide Program

The purpose of school-wide Title I program is to improve the entire educational program in a Title I school, which should result in improving the academic achievement of all students, particularly the lowest-achieving students. The goal of such a program is to assist the lowest-achieving students to demonstrate proficiency on academic achievement standards. Under the Elementary Secondary Education Act (ESEA) § 1114(a)(1), as amended by Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), a school may operate a school-wide program if it meets any of the following criteria

- A Title I school with 40 percent or more of its students living in poverty, regardless of the grades it serves, or
- A Title I school that receives a waiver from the state education agency (SEA) to operate a school-wide program without meeting the 40 percent poverty threshold.

ESSA allows states to grant waivers to implement school-wide Title I programs in schools with poverty levels below 40 percent. ESSA § 1114(a)(1)(B) grants this authority to states but requires that states establish a process for the review and approval of waiver requests that ensures that a school-wide program will best meet the needs of students in improving academic achievement.

Benefits of School-Wide Program

A school that operates a school-wide program can take advantage of numerous benefits including:

- Serving all students.
 - A school operating a school-wide program does not need to identify particular students as eligible to participate (ESEA § 1114(a)(2)(A)(i).
- Providing services that need not be supplemental.
 - A school operating a school-wide program does not need to provide specific services that supplement the services participating students would otherwise receive (ESEA § 1114(a)(2)(A)(ii)).

Requirements for Waivers of School-Wide Wavier

Local Education Agencies (LEAs) interested in implementing a School-Wide Title I program in a school that does not meet the 40 percent threshold must:

- Upload a waiver request letter, on LEA letterhead and signed by the director of schools, to the LEA
 Document Library in ePlan.tn.gov by April 15 of each year (Respective Funding Year, Consolidated Funding
 Application Documents);
- Complete the Title I School-Wide Program Waiver Request and upload it to the LEA Document Library in ePlan (Respective Funding Year, Consolidated Funding Application Documents); and
- Send an email to <u>Debby Thompson (Deborah.Thompson@tn.gov)</u> confirming the submission of a waiver request when both documents are successfully uploaded in ePlan.

All waiver requests must be submitted by **April 15** to be considered for the upcoming school year.
