


Overview



 Under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as authorized by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), there are several programs that require equitable participation of non-public school students and teachers.


Overview



- The requirement of providing equitable services is achieved through timely and meaningful consultation between the local education agency (LEA) and non-public school officials.
- The consultation process must occur prior to any decision that affects the opportunities of eligible non-public school students, teachers, and other educational personnel for equitable services.
- This consultation must be ongoing, continuing throughout the implementation and assessment of these activities.





Equitable Services— Intent

- The LEA should complete the Intent to Participate Form and send this form to eligible non-public schools within their boundaries or, for Title I, to those schools whose students reside in the LEA.
- Information collected should be used on the non-public survey and the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA).

Equitable Services Intent

Steps:

- 1. Send out the *Intent to Participate Form* to all eligible non-public schools.
- 2. Follow up and make sure that Non-Public Schools receive the form.
- 3. Give the school a firm deadline of when to return the form back to the LEA (no later than **Jan. 15**).
- 4. Gather forms and prepare for the Non-Public Survey.

Equitable Services - Survey

- The Non-Public School Survey for non-public school participation in equitable services is available in ePlan and is due mid-February (typically around Feb. 15).
- Survey responses will provide the information needed for the CFA and will be used to inform allocations for IDEA and Title I, Title I, Part C, Title II, Title III, and Title IV.



Equitable Services – Survey

- The Non-Public School Survey is in ePlan >
 Data and Information. The survey imports each LEA's non-public schools from the School Directory.
- Once imported, the school list can be modified by the user in ePlan—this will be important for LEAs that share a non-public school with another LEA.
- The Non-Public Survey Guidance Document is available in ePlan > TDOE Resources > Equitable Services to Non-Public Schools (ESSA/IDEA/CTE) > ESSA Non-Public Schools Information > Equitable Services Webinars and TDOE Guidance.



FY23 Non-Public School Survey Instructions

Overview

The FY23 Non-Public School Survey for non-public school participation in equitable services will open on Jan. 3, 2022 and is due Feb. 18, 2022. The survey will be entered directly in ePlan, will be used to inform allocations for non-public schools for Titles I, II, III, and IV, and IDEA, and will populate the FY23 consolidated funding application (CFA) in spring 2022. All local education agencies (LEAs) must submit a survey, even if the LEA does not have or serve a non-public school. The survey allows an LEA to indicate if this is the case.

Intent to Participate

As a reminder, prior to the completion of this survey, LEAs should have sent the <u>intent to participate</u> forms to non-public schools regarding participation in eligible programs by Dec. 1, 2021. These forms must be sent to non-public schools located in the LEA and, for Title I, to non-public schools with enrolled students who live in the LEA's attendance areas. LEAs should also confirm that their non-public/private school list in the <u>School Directory</u> is accurate. Please report any directory updates to <u>Private Schools@tn.gov</u>.

The intent to participate form is available in TDOE Resources in ePlan (see the screenshot below). These forms are due to the LEA from non-public schools no later than **Jan. 15, 2022** and should inform the completion of the Non-Public School Survey.



Survey Location and Completion

The Non-Public School Survey is located in ePlan under *Data and Information*. The Non-Public School Survey will automatically import each of the LEA's non-public schools that were listed from the previous year's non-public survey. Once imported, the school list can be modified by the user in ePlan—this will be important for LEAs that share a non-public school with another LEA. If a non-public school needs to be added to the LEA's list of non-public schools, please contact <u>Danny Bounds@tn.gov</u>.

When completing the survey, <u>please be sure all selections match</u> and are correct prior to submission. In particular:

- For all schools marked as participating in any of the grants, please make sure to enter the correct student data/numbers in the corresponding column (see 2b. below).
- If the school is participating in Title I or III, there should be a student count in the corresponding column(s). For non-participation, there should not be a student count in the corresponding column.
- LEAs that do not have or serve a non-public school must indicate this with the available checkbox and follow the steps to submit the survey.

Equitable Services – Survey

Steps:

- 1. Collect *Intent to Participate* forms from eligible non-public schools.
- 2. Check the *Non-Public School Directory*.
- 3. Read the Non-Public Survey guidance in ePlan > TDOE Resources > Equitable Services to Non-Public Schools (ESSA/IDEA/CTE) > ESSA Non-Public Schools Information > Equitable Services Webinars and TDOE Guidance.
- 4. Update the *Non-Public Survey*.
- 5. Complete the survey by the mid-February deadline.

Equitable Services - Consultation

■ ESSA requires **timely and meaningful consultation** between the LEA and non-public school officials prior to any decision that affects the opportunities of eligible non-public school children, families, and teachers to participate in ESSA programs, and shall continue throughout the implementation and assessment of activities. (ESSA §§ 1117, 8501)



Equitable Services – Consultation

- Consultations must address the following for eligible non-public school children:
 - how the LEA will identify needs;
 - what services the LEA will offer;
 - how and when LEAs make decisions about the delivery of services;
 - how, where, and by whom LEAs will provide services; and
 - how LEAs assess the academic services to non-public school children, and how LEAs use the results to improve Title I, Part A services.



Equitable Services – Consultation

- LEAs should complete the Affirmation of Meaningful Consultation Form* with Non-Public Schools.
- The consultation process between public and non-public school officials regarding Title program services should result in a program designed to meet the educational needs of eligible nonpublic school children.

Affirmation of Meaningful Non-Public School Consultation & Agreement

Overview

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) in 55 1117 and 8501 requires LEAs to provide equitable services to students and teachers in eligible non-public schools. The requirement of providing equitable services is achieved through timely and meaningful consultation between the LEA and non-public school officials. The consultation process must occur prior to any decision that affects the opportunities of eligible non-public school students, teachers, and other educational personnel for equitable services. This consultation must be ongoing, continuing throughout the implementation and assessment of these activities. Further, LEAs are required to finalize all ESSA equitable service agreements with the non-public school officials. An Affirmation of Meaningful Non-Public School Consultation and Agreement form shall be signed by the LEA and non-public officials) and uploaded to ePlan. LEAs that have uploaded consultation agreements for each participating non-public school will have satisfied the ESSA requirement that consultation agreements be forwarded to the ombudstman.

State Ombudsman

To help ensure equitable services and other benefits are being provided for eligible non-public school students, teachers, and other educational personnel, the state must designate an ombudsman to monitor and enforce the requirements under both Title I and Title VIII. Tennessee has designated the department's federal programs ombudsman to meet these ESSA equitable services requirements. If there has been no consultation or agreement between the LEA and the non-public school, a complaint may be filed on behalf of the non-public school by completing the Complaint to the Ombudsman form found in eplan.tn.gov > TDOE Resources > ESSAIDEA Non-Public Schools Information & Documents. Affirmation of Meaningful Non-Public School Consultation & Agreement

This sample form covers the meaningful consultation process (Part I) and final agreement (Part II) between each LEA and non-public school and can be edited to meet stakeholders' needs. Documentation of the consultation process and non-public school agreement must be uploaded annually to ePlan by the LEA. LEAs may choose to upload forms as part of the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) (due by May 1) or to eplan th gov > FY22 LEA Document Library > Non-Public/Private Schools Documents > ESEA Private Schools Information & Documents > Annually Required Documents > Private Schools Equitable Services Agreements (due by Aug. 1). Agreements must be signed by the representatives of both the LEA and the non-public school.

Quick Notes

- 2. Continue consulting with Non-Public Schools over spring and summer.
- 3. Update CFA with information related to equitable services.
- 4. Get ready to complete Agreement and plan(s) for delivery of services by August.



The Agreement of Services

August – May



Equitable Services - Agreement

- LEAs are required to document that:
 - meaningful consultation took place and
 - a final agreement was reached between the LEA and non-public school officials.
- Traditionally, the Affirmation of Meaningful Non-Public School Consultation form is submitted in May with the CFA and the Final Agreement is then uploaded to ePlan in August.
- Tennessee LEAs now have two options to meet this requirement: the Traditional or Combined form.



Equitable Services – Agreement

- The **traditional forms** might be a better option for LEAs with many participating non-public schools and/or those with non-public schools who participate in Title I, Part A.
 - Traditional Affirmation Form
 - Traditional Final Agreement Form
- The **combined form** might be a better option for LEAs with a small number of participating non-public schools who do not participate in Title I, Part A.
 - Combined Form

Equitable Services – Agreement

Steps

- 1. Decide whether the LEA will use the Traditional Form or the Combined Form:
 - If Combined Form, it is due with CFA submission.
 - If Traditional Form, it is due Sept. 15 in ePlan > LEA Document Library.
- 2. Make sure that an affirmation and agreement of services is completed with the Non-Public School and submitted in ePlan.
- 3. Continue ongoing consultation and obligate services in a timely manner as requested from the Non-Public School.








