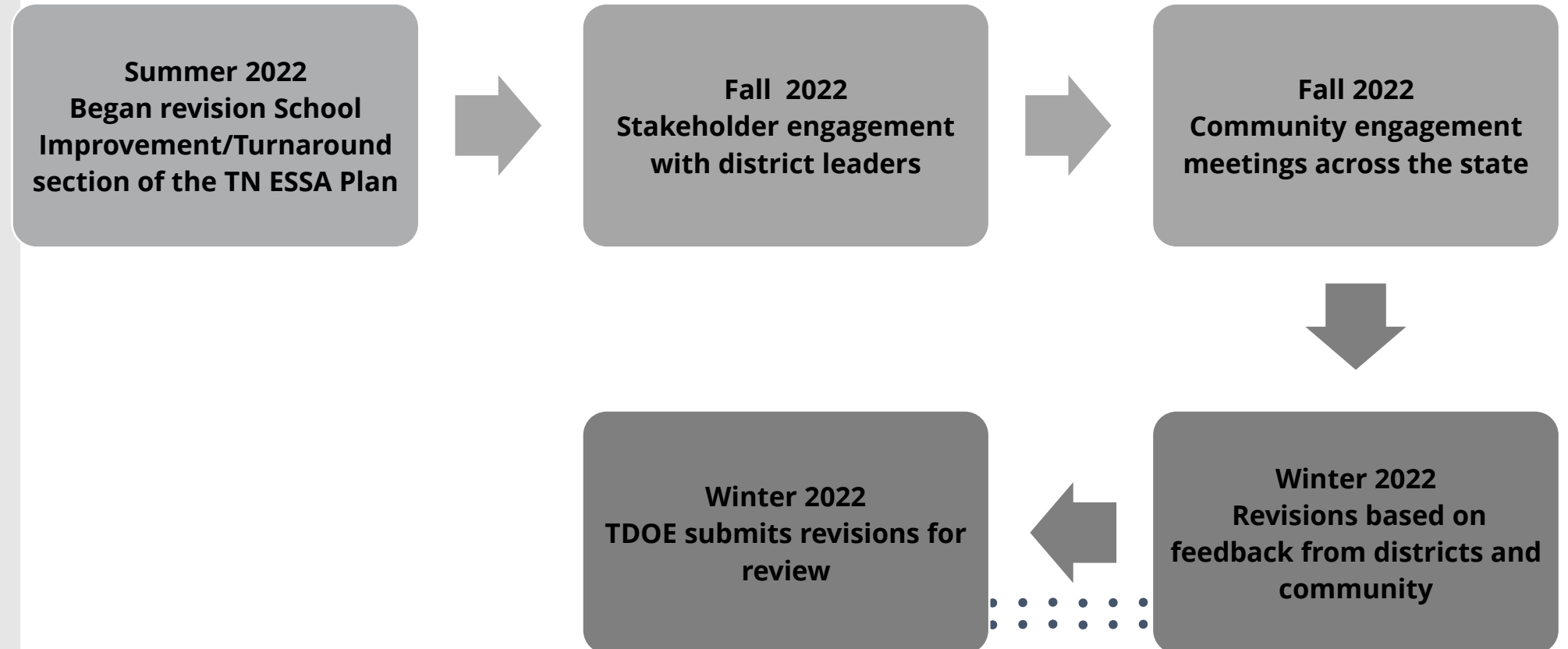
TN ESSA Plan Revisions





ESSA Plan Revisions

- Between now and the winter of 2022, we will conduct meetings across the state to gather feedback from stakeholders on the department's initial draft of the ESSA Plan revisions.
- Beginning immediately, we will have initial conversations with district leaders followed by community engagement meetings.

School Turnaround Framework

Purpose

The School Turnaround Framework is a tier model designed to create a clear continuum of support, interventions, monitoring and expectations for schools, districts, and the department for schools designated as:

- Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI),
- Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI),
and
- Priority/ Comprehensive Improvement and Support (CSI)

Philosophy

The School Turnaround Framework is grounded in the philosophy that districts should lead the work for schools in pre-tier and Tier 1 with increasing intervention by the department for schools in Tiers 2 and 3. Schools are placed in tiers based on the current accountability system, the number of years the school has been identified for improvement, and progress toward improvement.

Tier Placement

- Pre-tier: All schools that receive either a TSI or ATSI designation
- Tier 1: Schools that receive a Priority/CSI School designation that are newly identified or making sufficient progress*
- Tier 2: Schools that have received a Priority/CSI School designation on at least two of the last three designation lists and are not making sufficient progress*
- Tier 3- Schools that have received a Priority/CSI School designation on at least two of the last three designation lists, are not making sufficient or declining progress*, and do not demonstrate readiness for school turnaround efforts

* Sufficient progress is defined as meeting at least one of the priority exit criteria in the previous year

Improvement Planning

- Pre-Tier: Partner with regional CORE staff to revise the current school improvement plan based upon prioritized needs of the identified student groups.
- Tier 1: Conduct a needs assessment utilizing all data that was not included in the current school year plan and revise the current school turnaround plan.
- Tier 2: Conduct a comprehensive school analysis and revise the current school turnaround plan.
- All school improvement (Pre-Tier) and school turnaround plans (Tiers 1-3) must be approved by the district and the department.

Funding

- To support TSI schools, districts must utilize funds from eligible Title programs that connect with the identified needs and/or strategies that address the identified student groups.
- ATSI schools will be eligible for school improvement grants, beginning in the initial placement year.
- For tiers 1, 2 and 3, the district must develop a funding allocation structure to allocate school improvement funds that meets the Framework requirement that 80% of school improvement funds must flow to the school to implement evidence-based strategies and/or interventions.

Monitoring

- District Monitoring
 - Learning Walks
 - School Reviews
 - Data Analysis
 - End of Year Reporting
- Department Monitoring
 - School Reviews
 - Data Analysis
 - Monthly support meetings
 - Bi-annual Milestone Meetings

Academic Requirements

Districts/Schools in all tiers are required to:

- Verify all teachers have training in foundational literacy skills
- Use department tools when reviewing and selecting curriculum to ensure materials are high quality and standards-aligned
- Utilize department provided resources and programs where applicable
- Additional requirements are outlined for each tier.

Student Readiness Requirements

Districts/Schools in all tiers are required to:

- Participate in school culture/climate survey
- Participate in culture building training including trauma-informed practices, positive behavior supports, and Resilient District training (where applicable) provided by the department
- Implement School Safety Plans which address both physical and mental safety and should include access to a School Resource Officer
- Utilize department provided resources and programs where applicable
- Additional requirements are outlined for each tier.

Educator Requirements

Districts/Schools in all tiers are required to:

- Conduct a landscape study around school vacancies
- Utilize department provided resources and programs where applicable
- Additional requirements are outlined for each tier.

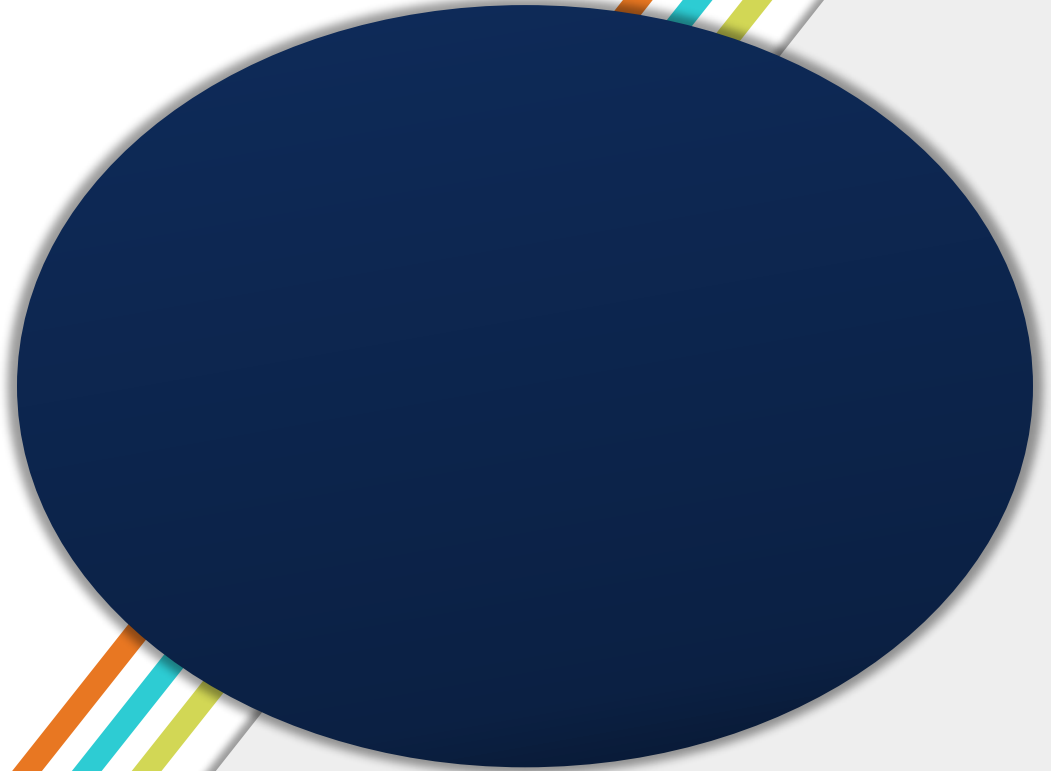
Supports

Support provided to all schools include:

- District and school turnaround planning support
- Resource allocation assistance to support equitable distribution of federal funds/resources
- Weekly office hours to assist with turnaround needs
- Networking opportunities for school and district leaders
- Professional learning opportunities
- Quarterly Newsletters
- Additional supports are outlined for each tier.

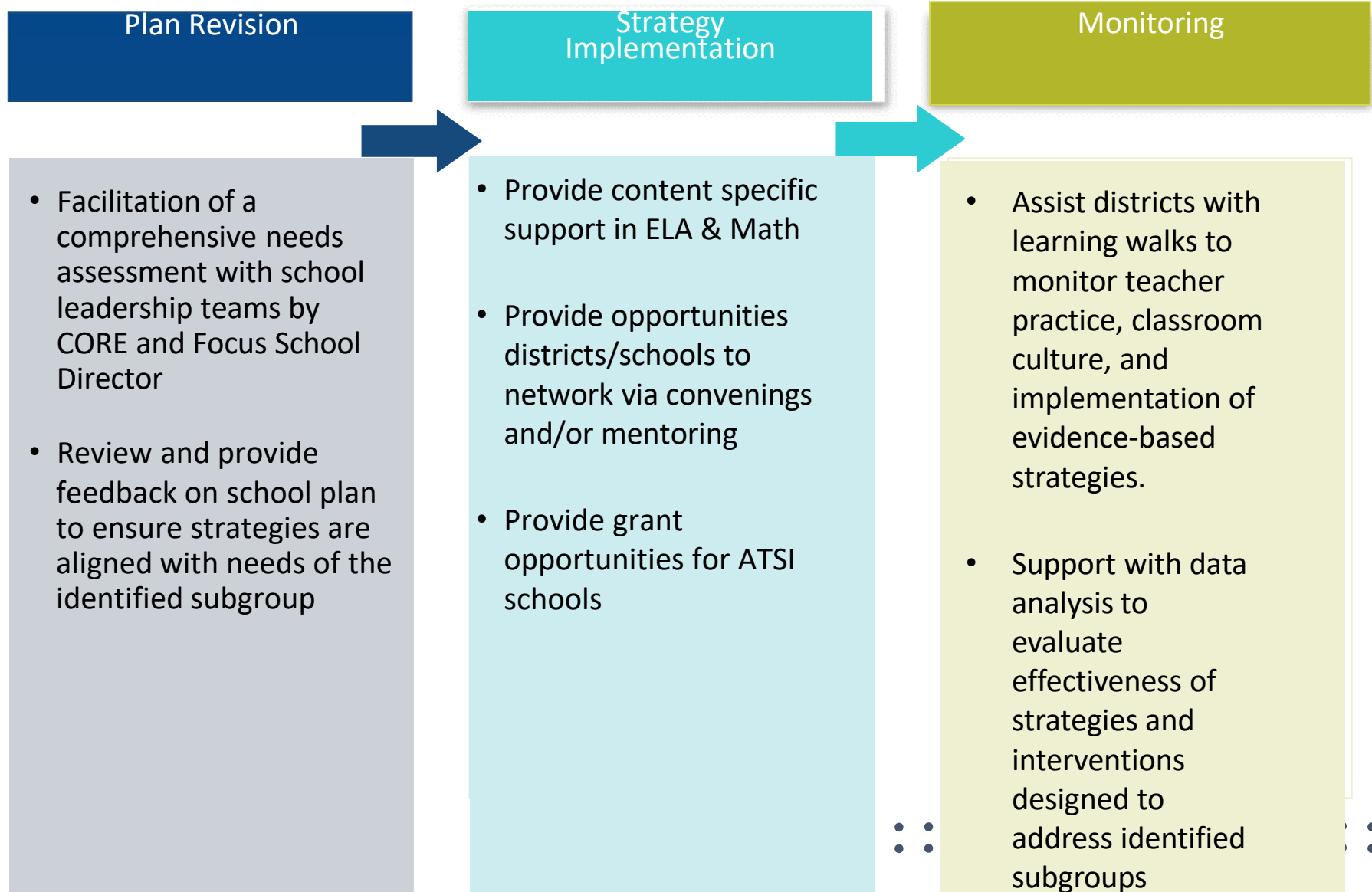
School Designations

Date	Action
August 24	School designations and data available to districts in the Accountability Application for the annual 10-day appeals window
September 7	The appeals window closes
September 9	School designation letters sent to districts, under embargo until September 12
September 12	Data publicly released
September 26 - October 4	DST & CORE conduct regional meetings with newly identified TSI, ATSI, and Priority schools to discuss designation requirements
October 5 – November 4	Newly identified schools will revise school plans with support from CORE and DST
November 5	Newly identified schools revised school plans are due to LEA
November 18	Newly identified schools revised school plans are due to SEA

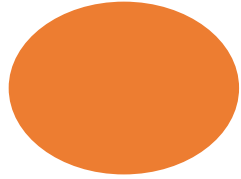

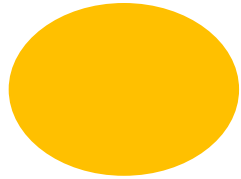

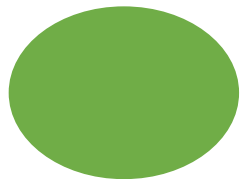
District Turnaround Planning Support

DST directors provide support to district leaders on the development of a district turnaround plan to support the identified prioritized needs for the priority schools in the district.



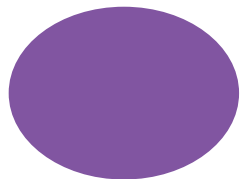
School Turnaround Planning Support

DST directors support district and school leaders in the facilitation of a comprehensive needs assessment followed by a guided planning process to develop a school turnaround plan.



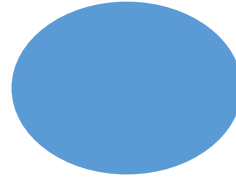
Grant Funding Opportunity

Allocate school improvement funds to districts to support the implementation of evidence-based strategies outlined in the district turnaround plan and school turnaround plans.



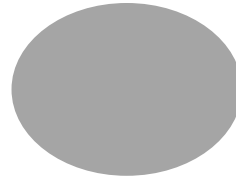
Turnaround Leader Network

Networking opportunities for school leaders to build their capacity in creating the conditions for rapid and sustained change within their school



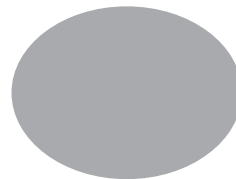
Monitoring

Directors conduct monthly support meetings with district leadership to ensure evidence-based strategies are being implemented, data are being analyzed to measure progress, and barriers are identified and addressed.



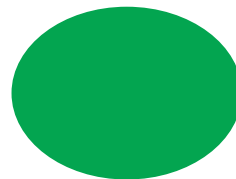
Milestone Visits

DST conducts bi-annual milestone visits to districts and schools to monitor implementation and effectiveness of evidence-based strategies outlined in the district and school turnaround plans.



Resource Allocation Support

Directors provide guidance to district leaders on equitable distribution of federal funds and resources to support school turnaround.



Weekly Office Hours

Directors hold weekly office hours to offer technical assistance to districts serving priority schools.

School Turnaround Pilot Program

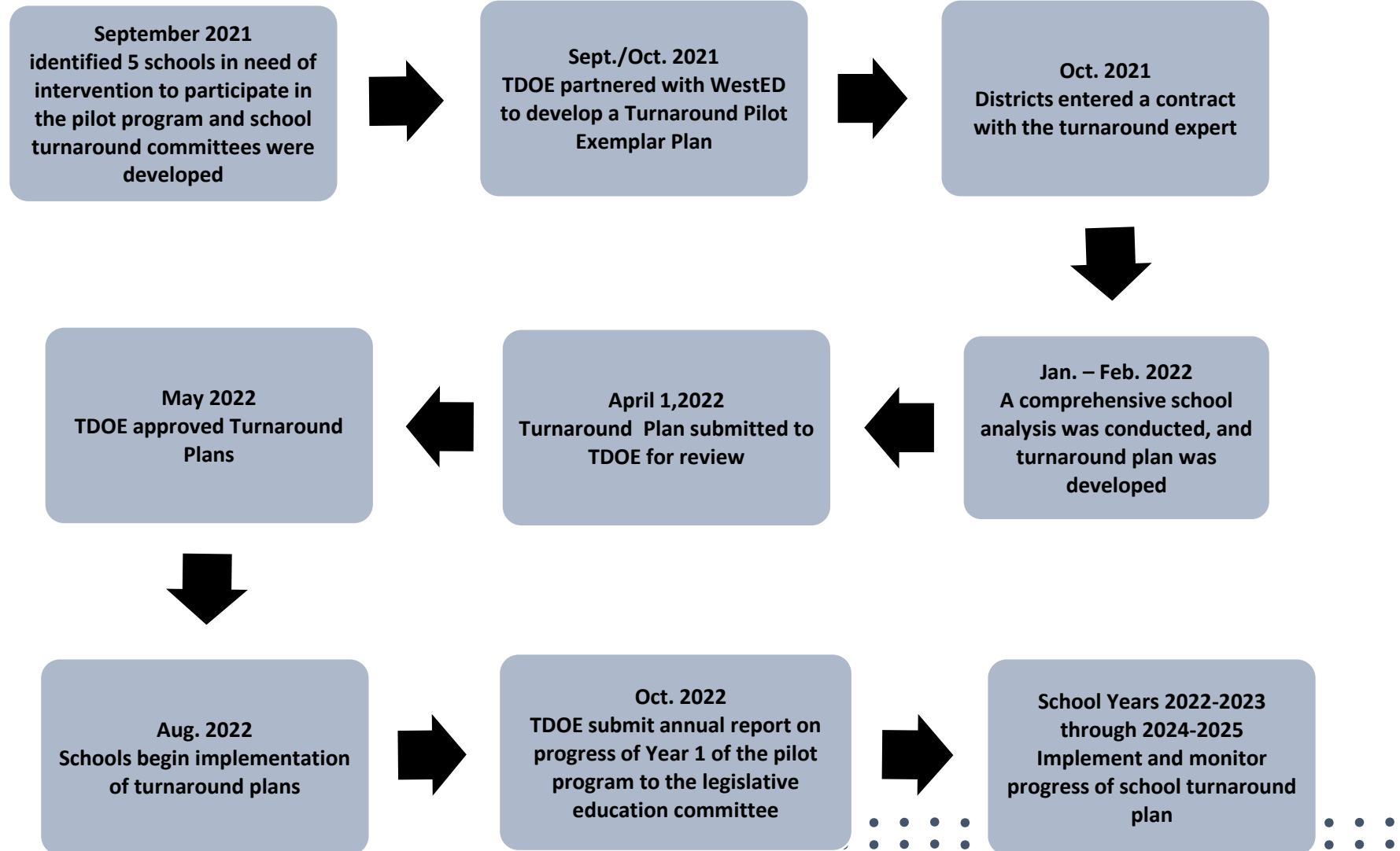
- The Department created and developed a four-year School Turnaround Pilot Program for priority schools as defined in Senate Bill 122 and Public Chapter 0578.

ASD 1.0 Update – Exiting Schools

Four direct-run ASD schools transitioned back to their home district, Memphis/Shelby County Schools (MSCS), on July 1 for the 2022-23 school year:

- Corning Achievement Elementary
- Frayser Achievement Elementary
- Georgian Hills Achievement Elementary
- Whitney Achievement Elementary

Individual transition plans were developed, in partnership with MSCS.

- Plans were approved by the MSCS board and the Commissioner



ASD 1.0 Update – Exiting Schools

There are three ASD charter schools that earned priority exit and transitioned to the TN Public Charter School Commission (TSCC) on July 1 for the 2022-23 school year:

- Libertas Montessori
- Cornerstone Prep – Denver Campus
- Lester Prep

Three additional ASD schools transitioned students for the 2022-23 school year to other schools within MSCS:

- Pathways in Education – Memphis
- Pathways in Education – Whitehaven
- KIPP Memphis Academy Elementary

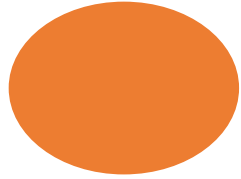
