Stronger Connections Grant Affirmation of Meaningful Non-Public School Consultation & Final Agreement

Combined Affirmation & Agreement forms with non-public schools are due in ePlan by Sept. 1.

Overview

On June 25, 2022, President Biden signed the <u>Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA)</u> into law. This legislation expands mental health services and provides additional support for states and local educational agencies (LEAs) to design and enhance initiatives that will promote safer, more inclusive, and positive school environments for all students, educators, and school staff.

The BSCA includes \$1 billion through Title IV, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) for state educational agencies (SEAs) to award competitively subgrants to high-need LEAs to establish safer and healthier learning environments, and to prevent and respond to acts of bullying, violence, and hate that impact school communities at individual and systemic levels, among other programs and activities. The U.S. Department of Education (ED) has designated this component of the BSCA the Stronger Connections Grant (SCG) program.

Under Stronger Connections, a SEA must make subgrant awards on a competitive basis to high-need LEAs, as determined by the SEA, and funds may be used only for activities authorized under ESEA Title IV, Part A § 4108 (i.e., Safe and Healthy Students). All SCG funds must be obligated by Sept. 30, 2026.

As funding for the SCG program is provided through ESEA Title IV, Part A, LEAs receiving grant funds must, after timely and meaningful consultation with appropriate non-public school officials, provide eligible non-public school students and educators services and other benefits that are equitable in comparison to services and other benefits provided with SCG funds to public school students and educators. More information about the SCG, including information about the four SCG areas of focus and the allowable use of funds can be found in the SCG Technical Guide.

The requirement of providing equitable services is achieved through timely and meaningful consultation between the LEA and non-public school officials. The consultation process must occur prior to any decision that affects the opportunities of eligible non-public school students, teachers, and other educational personnel for equitable services. This consultation must be ongoing, continuing throughout the implementation and assessment of these activities. Further, LEAs are required to finalize all SCG equitable service agreements with non-public school officials. An Affirmation of Meaningful Non-Public School Consultation and Agreement form shall be signed by the LEA and non-public official(s) and uploaded in ePlan with the Stronger Connections Grant application. LEAs that have uploaded consultation agreements for each participating non-public school will have satisfied the ESEA requirement that consultation agreements be forwarded to the ombudsman.



State Ombudsman

To help ensure equitable services and other benefits are being provided for eligible non-public school students, teachers, and other educational personnel, the state must designate an ombudsman to monitor and enforce the requirements under the SCG. Tennessee has designated the department's Title II and equitable services coordinator as the ombudsman for SCG equitable services requirements. If there has been no consultation or agreement between the LEA and the non-public school, a complaint may be filed on behalf of the non-public school by completing the Complaint to the Ombudsman form found in ePlan.tn.gov > TDOE Resources > Equitable Services to Non-Public Schools > ESSA Non-Public Schools Information > Equitable Services Complaint to the Ombudsman. Complaints must be signed by the individual(s) or organization(s) filing the complaint and copied to the LEA.
