Traditional Alternative Programs

- Students are referred by the homeschool for 11 – 180 days
- The homeschool completes the data in a separate database dashboard
- The operations team initiates the documentation
- The students are assigned a placement

- Parents are notified of the placement
- Each school has orientation every Tuesday and Thursday
- Emphasis on Satisfactory Student Attendance
- Individualized Student Success Plan
- Alternative Education Specialists with complete Mental Health Team



Success Schools Programs

- The Success School Intervention Model is an award winning and nationally recognized educational alternative to the traditional school.
- Serves a dual purpose by serving students who are experiencing academic as well as behavioral challenges in the traditional school setting.
- Success Schools focus on educating the whole child by providing smaller nonpunitive learning communities; creating schools within schools.
- We believe every child is a diamond in the making.



Overage for Grade Programs Prep Schools

- Serve Overage for grade High School students that are two or more years behind
- Offer innovative, rich, rigorous, and engaging programs designed to address the individual academic and developmental needs of students.
- Extended-day
- Block schedule that allows high schools students to earn more credits than traditional schools

- Our instructional program includes on-line courses, and dual enrollment.
- There are opportunities for students to graduate high school on time.
- Increase the graduation rate.
- Prepares students for entering the work force after graduation.



Newcomer International Center (NIC) Programs

- Two-year, Intensive English program for new-to-country students of high school age who have had interruptions in their formal education
- Students entering the 9th grade.
- NIC's specialized program allows students to gain literacy and numeracy skills while earning graduation credits in core subjects.

- The goal of NIC is to help students gain the skills they will need to be successful when they transition to a traditional high school setting.
- All NIC teachers specialize in both CONTENT and ESL
- NIC's coursework focuses on language acquisition through core content while earning elective and core content credits.

Incarcerated Youth Programs

- Students who are detained
- Educate the students on a 180-day school calendar
- Shelby County Juvenile Court Youth Services Bureau

- Licensed/Certified Teachers
- Behavior Specialists
 - Professional Guidance Counselor
- School Psychologist
- School Social Worker





Youth Advocacy Program

- Supports and advocates for teen parents, ensuring their comprehension needs are met while attending Memphis-Shelby County Schools.
- Supports teen mothers and fathers
- Provide childcare assistance

- Year-long teen
 parent programs
- Student parent support
- Dropout prevention
- Establish and strengthen community partnerships
- Establish school-based partnerships
- Assist teen parents with baby essentials
