

21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) Cohort 22 Grantees

Background

The Nita M. Lowey 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) program provides federal funding to establish or expand community learning centers. These centers provide students with opportunities for academic enrichment, youth development, and family support during non-school hours or during periods when school is not in session. Originally funded by direct grants from the U.S. Department of Education (ED), responsibility for the administration of this program was transferred to state education agencies (SEAs) under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Current guidelines for the administration of the 21st CCLC grant can be found under Title IV, Part B of the ESEA as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Organizations eligible for the competitive grant may include both local educational agencies (LEAs) and Community-Based Organizations (CBOs).

The purposes of the 21st CCLC program are to:

1. provide opportunities for academic enrichment, including providing tutorial services to help students (particularly students in high-poverty areas and those who attend low-performing schools) meet State and local student performance standards in core academic subjects such as reading and mathematics;
2. offer students a broad array of additional services, programs, and activities, such as youth development activities, drug and violence prevention programs, counseling programs, art, music, and recreation programs, technology education programs, and character education programs, that are designed to reinforce and complement the regular academic program of participating students; and
3. offer families of students served by community learning centers opportunities for literacy and related educational development.
