SBE Meeting Updates <u>Assessment Policy</u> on Final Read

The following updates were approved on *final read* during the November 2024 SBE meeting and are **currently in effect**.

ILL Reactivation: The NES 815 assessment is now available as an option for candidates seeking <u>reactivation</u> of an expired Instructional Leader License

SBE Meeting Updates <u>Licensure Policy</u> on Final Read

The following updates were approved on *final read* during the February 2025 SBE meeting and are **currently in effect**.

- Endorsement Flexibilities: Removed of specific grade bands from 'one-up, one-down' flexibilities
 - What will this look like? For example, an educator with an English 6-8 endorsement could now teach courses in the same endorsement area in grades 5 and 9.
- Adding Endorsements: Expanded pathways for adding additional endorsements
 - Detailed in the updated Educator Licensure Operations document
- Provisional Endorsements: Added new provisional endorsements
 - o Provisional Integrated Early Childhood Education Birth-K
 - Provisional Integrated Early Childhood Education pre-K-3

Endorsement Flexibilities

All educators can teach one grade level above and one grade level below the grade band on their endorsement within their endorsement area.

Educator holds	They can teach
K-5 elementary endorsement	PreK
Old K-6 elementary endorsement	Any subject in 7 th grade
Middle Grades Math Endorsement	5 th grade Math 9 th grade Math CANNOT teach Algebra 1 because the EOC rule trumps the grade span flexibilities

Adding Endorsements

Assessment Only – Educator only needs to pass the content assessment(s) for that endorsement area.

- If the endorsement requires multiple assessments, they must have passing scores on ALL assessments.
- Educator will submit the add endorsement request once they have the necessary assessments on file.


Coursework Only – Educator must complete the coursework for an additional endorsement program but will not need to take the assessments.

- This requires completion of the full additional endorsement program as approved by the state
- EPP submits the transaction on behalf of the educator once coursework has ben completed

Adding Endorsements


The updated additional endorsement chart boils down to this:

- Any educator can add any endorsement that isn't SPED through assessment only or coursework only
- SPED educators can add any other SPED endorsement through assessment only or coursework only
- Educators without a SPED endorsement will need to complete both coursework and pass the assessment to add SPED endorsements



Adding Special Education Endorsements

Emergency Credentials

- An emergency credential is **not** a license
- Educators enrolled in a job-embedded program MUST hold a practitioner license during their job-embedded clinical practice.
- Application window for emergency credentials opens July 1st
- All emergency credentials expire on June 30th
- Emergency credentials CANNOT be issued for positions requiring an ILL or a School Service Personnel License




Assessment Reminders

- Always check <u>Assessment</u>
 <u>Policy 5.105</u> for accepted tests and deadlines.
- Educators should register via the <u>TN-specific ETS</u> <u>webpage</u> to avoid nonaccepted assessments.
- If taken, scores from unaccepted assessments will not appear in TNCompass.



Additional Assessment Reminders

- Praxis scores must be sent directly from ETS to TNCompass—educator uploads are not accepted.
- Educators must Provide full
 SSN and designate TDOE (code
 8190) when registering or ordering score reports.
- Lack of a full SSN or recipient code prevents scores from posting to TNCompass, requiring resubmission and possible fees



Assessments that may be used for admission to educator preparation programs

Principles of Learning and Teaching

A pedagogical knowledge assessment may be required for individuals applying through an out-of-state pathway on the basis of completion of an approved out-of-state educator preparation program, as well as for occupational licensure applicants. Please review the Tennessee State Board of Education Policy 5.105: Professional Assessments for Tennessee Educators to determine the assessment requirements for Tennessee Educators.

Accreditation Update


- Previously: only Regionally Accredited degrees are accepted
- A rule change allows degrees from institutions accredited by CHEA or the U.S. Department of Education
- Now: will accept degrees from accrediting agencies listed under Part I of the CHEA list (CHEA website)



Arizona Reciprocity Update

The Arizona "Standard Professional Teaching Certificate with Deficiencies" does not meet NASDTEC reciprocity requirements and cannot be accepted in Tennessee.

 Previously reciprocated licenses remain valid, but educators must meet Tennessee renewal/advancement requirements upon expiration.



Special Education Endorsement Guidance

The course catalog provides guidelines on which endorsements are needed to serve as the teacher of record for that course.

Some endorsements may apply to a course, but specific student needs—such as those outlined in an Individualized Education Plan (IEP)—could have additional requirements.

We encourage you to read all course details, including the Notes section for more specifics.

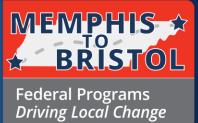
